The South Central Calhoun Board of Directors met in a Regular Meeting on Mon, Sept 19, 2022, at the SCC HS Media Center. President Judy Hungate called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm. Director members present included Vice-President Roger McKinney, Chris Green, Ryan Hammen, Jason Hawkins, Keaton Hildreth, and Nick Spencer (entered at 6:02). Others present included Supt Brad Anderson, Board Secretary Carol Collins, and a few guests.

and a few guests. McKinney motioned, Hawkins seconded, to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried 6-0 with Spencer absent.

COMMUNICATIONS

The Board recited the Pledge of Allegiance and Hawkins read the SCC Mission Statement: The mission of the South Central Calhoun School District is to partner with our communities to provide an environment rich with opportunities that challenge every student to master skills and understandings which will transfer into a successful future.

Spencer entered the meeting. <u>Public Input on Non-Agenda Items</u> There were no requests to speak.

Board Secretary Secretary Collins updated the estimated SAVE revenues of \$972,000 plus the final estimated catch-up payment of \$80,000 for the upcoming year. Points of the 2022-23 Coaches' Handbook were highlighted for Board consideration. The Board is scheduled for High Five Friday on Nov 11 at the elementary.

A thank you note was shared with the Board.

Student Council

Caleb Blair, representing the SCC HS Student Council, reviewed homecoming activities and shared a few suggestions for changes next year, including a pep rally on Friday and offering a meal on the evening of the parade and coronation as a fundraiser for HS initiatives. The supply shelf at the HS for students to get personal items is well received. The Board thanked Caleb for sharing the information.

Induction Coach Sheila Welander, Induction Coach, reviewed the Induction Coach process during the first 3 years for new teachers. She works with 15 SCC teachers upon hire as an initial contact for a range of questions and information. A coaching cycle with new teachers includes lesson planning, observation, reflection, and analyzing student work. At the end of each year. new teachers are asked to reflect on their induction coaching experience: the common theme of their input is that Welander boosts their self-confidence, provides professional and personal support, and makes the coaching cycle process daily r ing. The Board thanked Welander for her time and continued commitment to the staff and students ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

groups to define goals and review testing data.

Principal DeMoss provided fall testing data, noting incoming 4th graders had positive scores. Most students identified for support have been receiving additional instruction since the start of school. Building initiatives to promote inclusion and belonging include activities once a month for all students and 8th graders partnering with 4th graders for academic games and activities.

Principal Martin reported that more than half of the HS students are enrolled in academic and career college credit courses. Review of the first day of school schedule for freshmen and new students provided input for next year. PLC work on Sept 14 included review of testing data.

Supt Anderson recognized the classified staff - including drivers, associates and custodians - for their service to the district. Many of these employees are the first contact most students have to set the tone each day. School safety projects and conversations continue, including security system installation, required drills, and environmental study. School Improvement Advisory Committee meetings are scheduled for Oct 20, Jan 26 and Apr 20 for parents, students or community members interested in identifying and strategizing district initiatives and needs: contact the Central Office for more infor-
